<p>EXAMPLE</p> <p>In-experienced Drivers</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Higher risk than more experienced drivers • Cause higher risk for other road users • More probability of crash • Less likely to wear seat belts and severity could be high • Distraction prone • Unfamiliar with vehicles 	<p>A</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Incremental assignment of driving responsibilities • On-road assessments • Defensive driving training • In-vehicle coaching • Enforce seat belt use in this worker population • Driver training should address distraction awareness and hazard perception skills that may be lacking • Set policy according to provincial graduated licensing • Require a violation free driving record at time of hire 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Immediate and recorded on personnel files • All drivers by January 1/2007 • All drivers by January 1/2007 • All drivers by January 1/2007 • Campaign and monitoring August /2006 • Included in defensive driving training • Incorporate into our policy by August/2006 • Immediate.
